The undersigned has had
under his consideration a petition
of certain chiefs and warriors
of the Saulteau and Kamlay
Cree Tribes of Indians near
the mouth of the Red River, setting
forth that the promises made to
them at the conclusion of the
Treaty of 1871 have not been
fulfilled, and that a state of
general dissatisfaction exists
prevails in consequence among
them.

The petitioners further set
forth that the annuity of three
dollars (\$3) granted to them
under that Treaty is wholly
inadequate to their wants, and
pray that it ~~be~~ be increased
to five dollars (\$5) the amount
of the annuity allowed the
Indian parties to the Treaty at
the North-West Angle. The
undersigned finds that a
copy of this petition was sent
to the Indian Commissioners
for Manitoba and the North-
West on the receipt of it
