Mr. Booth and Mr. Moore, of the International Committee, were visitors to the Association. Mr. Booth conducted several religious meetings and Bible Classes while here, and quite won the hearts, as well as the thanks of the members who met with him, being used as well of the Master in helping special cases. It is with feelings of sincere regret that the Board and Association must agree to accede to Mr. F. P. Bronson's request to be allowed to retire from the Booard of Directors, and from the position of Treasurer, in both of which positions he has rendered the Association conspicuous service.

Quite a large contingent of members attended the Provincial Convention at Brockville in January. The thanks of the Association are due and are hereby tendered to Mr. Alex. Lumsden. M.P.P., and Mr. C. B. Norman McLeod, B.A., B.D., for the series of Bible Readings conducted by him with so much profit to a large number of the members and their friends.
