A Film expose that is an expose and no more is scarcely good entertainment, though educational. Yet an entertaining play without a purpose is just as insane.

"The Sealed Envelope" which presents a vivid story of underworld intrigue and political machinations at the Star beginning Monday combines the qualities of education with 100 per cent. entertainment. Under Douglas Gerrard's artistically capable direction Fritzie Brunette, the Universal star, William Sheer, and their support including Martha Mattox, Katherine Wallace, Charles Dorian and Joseph W. Girard, have recorded a brilliantly dramatic performance.

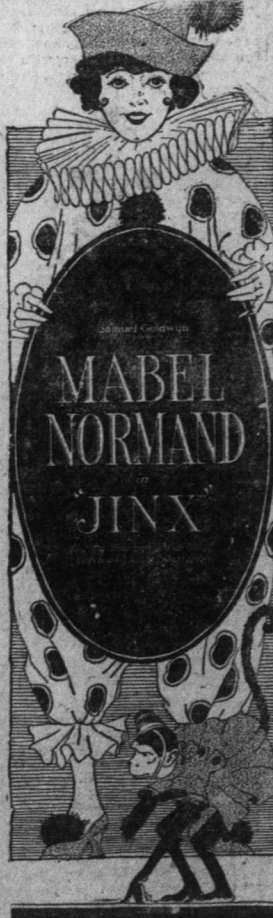
