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HONEY BEES ACCLIMATISED.—On the 27th of April, I again visited the bee-tree at Rockcliffe, referred to in the November, 1898, issue of THE NATURALIST and although late in the afternoon was pleased to find that the bees had again successfully wintered, as was evidenced by the marked activity above the entrance of the cavity in the tree. From the large number of bees to be seen coming and going, it seems probable that this colony has wintered quite as well, if not better than the average colony kept under artificial conditions.—P. H.
