B. at Inverness, Scot., in 1831. Ed. at the District School, Chinquacousy, Ont. Is an auctioneer and a valuator. Has been a mem. of Brampton Town Council for several years. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Liberal.—Brampton.

STRATTON, JAMES R. (West Peterboro).

Father came from the North of Irel. B. at Millbrook, Co. of Durham, May 3, 1859. Ed. in Peterborough. M. 17 Aug., 1831, E. J., eldest dan. of J. R. Ormond. In 1878, succeeding his father, he became publisher of the Peterborough Daily and Weekly Examiner newspaper. Is Presdt. of the Dominion Building & Loss Assoc. Has been a mem. of the Board of Education for several years. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1886, and re-elected g. e., 1890 and 1894. A Liberal.—Peterborough.

TAYLOR, WILLIAM HENRY (North Middlesex).

B. in the Tp. of Durham, Ont., 1848. Is a farmer Has been Reeve and Councillor of his municipality and Warden of the Co. of Middlesex. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e., 1894. A Liberal.—Parkhill.

TRUAY. REUBEN ELRIDGE (South Bruce).

Father came from the United States in 1814, and settled in the Eastern Townships, P.Q. B. in Montreal, 11 Oct., 1847, and ed. at the Public School, Walkerton. M., 24 May, 1870, Jessie Porteus of Tp. of Carrick. Is a sawniller, and proprietor of a planing mill and sash and door factory. Has been a Councillor of Walkerton, and was Mayor for two years, and Reeve for four years of that Town. Was elected for East Bruce in the Ho. of Commons at g. e., 1891, but unseated. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Liberal. — Walkerton.
