(making four representatives from these bodies) and of six members to be elected in the manner hereinafter provided by the registered members of the Medical Profession resident in the Province of Quebec, not connected with the teaching or examining bodies alluded to in this Act.

At present the representatives of the Province of Nova Scotia shall consist of one member chosen by Dalhousie College and four members to be elected in the manner hereinafter provided by the registered members of the Medical Profession in the Province of Nova Scotia not connected with the teaching or examining bodies alluded to in the Act. At present the representation of the Province of New Brunswick shall consist of five (5) members, to be elected in the manner hereinafter provided by the registered members of the Medical Profession in the Province of New Brunswick, not connected with the teaching or examining bodies alluded to in this Act.

Provided always that so soon as there shall have been established in actual operation for two years in any of the aforesaid provinces one or more Universities or bodies exercising Medical functions by a staff of teachers or Board of Examiners regularly conferring Medical degrees and approved of by the General Council other than those designated in this section, or so soon as any of the above designated Universities or bodies shall have ceased to exercise medical functions in either of the above mentioned ways, it shall be competent for the Governor in Council to alter and adjust the representation in accordance with the principle of this section, so that the several provinces shall continue to have the same number of members in the General Council provided for in this section.

ing to Quebec shall be elected at present, and, until an additional Medical School approved by the Council shall have been in actual operation for two years in Quebec, by the whole body of registered members of the Medical Profession of Quebec from amongst the aforesaid members; the additional representative of the school interest belonging to Nova Scotia shall be elected at present, and, until an additional Medical School approved by the Council shall have been in actual operation for two years in Nova Scotia, by the whole body of registered members of the Medical Profession of Nova Scotia from amongst the aforesaid members; and the three representatives of the school interest belonging to New Brunswick shall be elected at present, and, until one or more Medical Schools approved by the Council shall have been in actual operation for two years in New Brunswick, by the whole body of registered members of the Medical Profession belonging to New Brunswick.

Provided always that so soon as there shall have been established, and shall have been in actual operation for two years in any Province of the Dominion a greater number of Medical Schools authorized to grant degrees in Medicine and Surgery, and approved by the General Council, than is provided for in this section, it shall be competent for the Governor and Council so to alter or to add to or take from the representation of the aforesaid Universities and bodies that the teaching bodies in the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec shall have respectively only five representatives in the General Council, and that the teaching bodies in the Province of Nova Scotia shall have two representatives in the General Council, and that the teaching bodies in the Province of New Brunswick shall have three representatives in the General Council.
