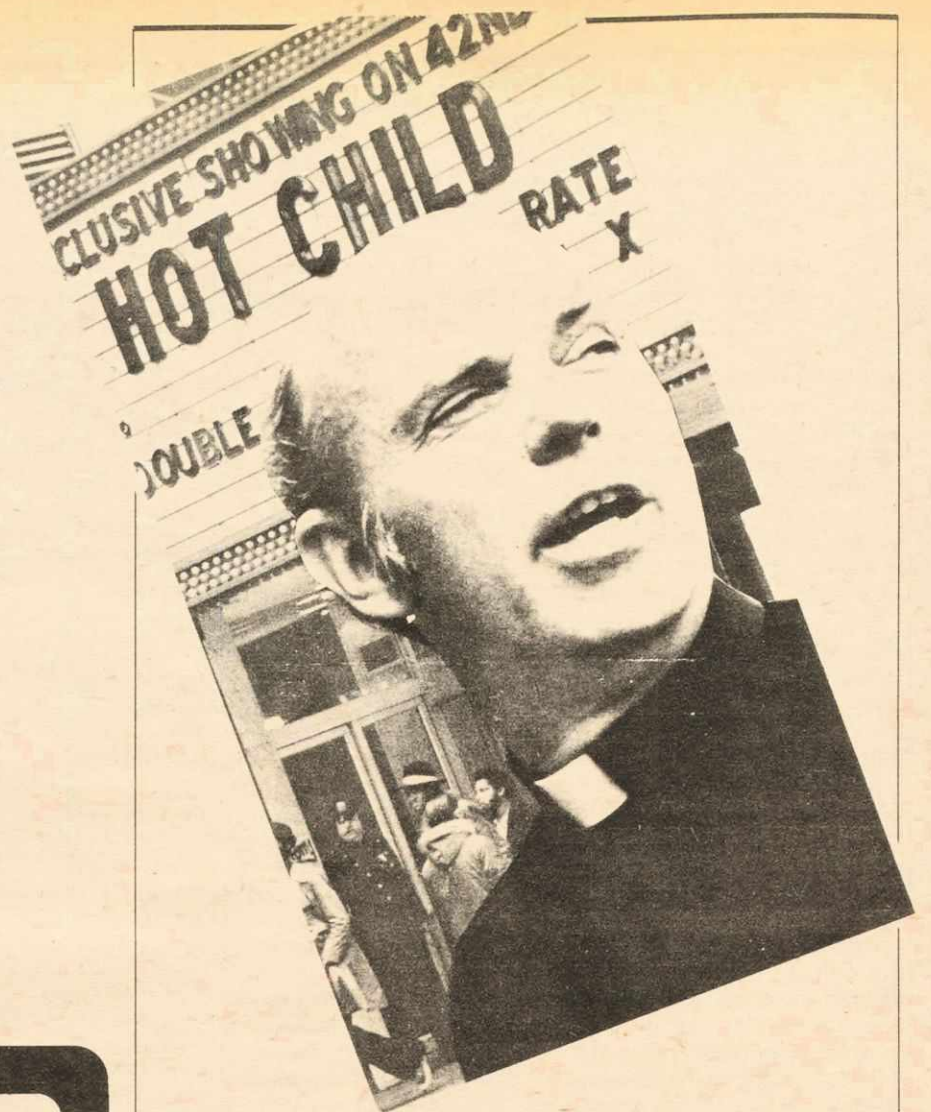
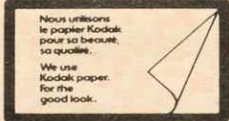

A refuge from a sick society

Some cities have a heart; New York just has a core -- a hard core that chews up young children and spits them out like so much useless garbage.

Yet at the centre of this refuse heap lies Under 21, a sanctuary for children who know New York too well, for runaways who have naively found themselves part of the 1.5 billion dollar a year sex industry in the city, and who want out.

Father Bruce Ritter is founder and president of New York's Covenant House (Under 21). As part of a tour of this area of the province, Father Ritter will speak about this unique child-care agency on Wednesday, March 17, at the St. Agnes Parish Hall, 6903 Mumford Road, at 3 p.m.

Father Ritter began Covenant House unofficially in 1969 when ten homeless and sexually abused teenage runaways sought refuge in his Lower East Side tenement apartment. As continued to come, Ritter took over empty apartments in the buildings, recruiting and financial aid from friends.

Since then Covenant House has grown to be a well respected child-care agency, offering its children a public school, an educational vocational centre, and, in general, opportunities they have never before had. It now keeps a paid staff of over 350 people and a volunteer staff of over 250.

In July of 1981, Covenant House opened its first overseas mission in Antigua, Guatemala. A similar sanctuary has just opened in Toronto to deal with the problems of the 7500 children who flock to the Yonge Street strip. Father Ritter hopes to open yet another Covenant House in Houston, Texas by June of this year.

In the first three years of its existence, the New York mission has helped more than 12,000 children, and many more show up at the doors every day. Noone is ever turned away, making expansion a necessary part of the sanctuary. The Covenant House budget for this year will run to 5.2 million dollars, 2 million dollars of which is expected from a combination of federal, state and New York City funding.
