AN INFORMATION SESSION ON THE 1988 WUSC SEMINAR TO MALI WILL BE HELD ON OCTOBER 14, ROOM 124 CENTRAL SQUARE 4:00 - 5:30 P.M.

Interested students are invited to attend.

The World University Service of Canada is a non-government organization involved in international development. Each year, WUSC organizes a summer seminar in a different country.

This year, thirty students from Canadian universities and colleges will be selected to participate in the summer programme which begins in mid-June 1988. The seminar includes approximately six weeks of travel and study that provide a first-hand introduction to various aspects of international development.

The working language of the seminar to Mali will be French, and selected students must prepare written reports on their study area in French.

While students participating will be required to raise a portion of their programme costs, the remainder of the funding will be provided by CIDA and WUSC; programme costs include travel, meals, lodging and all seminar activities, including orientation in Ottawa and in Mali on arrival.

GRADUATE RECORD EXAMINATION

Are you graduating in 1988? Are you planning to apply for admission to Graduate Schools in North America? Many graduate schools and fellowship sponsors use test results from the Graduate Record Examination in their selection process.

The next testing date in Toronto for the Graduate Record Exam is December 12, 1987; the exam will be written on the University of Toronto campus. Registration in advance is normally required; the postmark date for regular registration is November 6 (late fee applies November 7 - 17).

The GRE Information Bulletin contains a registration form and instructions that you will need to register. Copies of the Bulletin are available on campus from the Faculty of Graduate Studies (N922 Ross), the Career and Placement Centre (N108 Ross); and the Office of Student Affairs (124 Central Square).

FOREIGN SERVICE EXAM

Students interested in writing the Foreign Service Exam are reminded that it will be held on Saturday, October 17th at 9:00 a.m. in Curtis Lecture Hall E for three hours. What are the implications of the YUSA strike for students? Some of the most frequently asked questions are answered below:

October 2 was the deadline for registration for all faculties. Will that deadline be extended?

The Office of the Registrar has released this statement:

"In response to work stoppage action, the fee payment and registration deadline for undergraduate students (including Atkinson College students) has been extended until further notice. Watch Excalibur for further details."

Are TTC buses crossing the picket lines? What are the routes?

YORK 106A: Turns at Canartic (East side of Keele)
YORK 106: Goes along Sentinel to Fourwinds Dr. and Murray Ross Parkway.
