seems to me that the possible economy resulting from the proposed modefication of the Commission is out weighed by the grave national complications which night result from the change. It is therefore recommended that instead of assigning the task of pri-- marily allothing the Reserve to the Indian Superintendents in their res-- pective Superintendencies, as proposed by that Order in Council of the 23rd February 1877, the present Commissioner Mr Sproat be appointed to discharge that important duty, subject to the ap-- proval of the Commissioner of Lands and Norks of Bribish Columbia, and in the event of any difference between the Commissioner and Mr Sproat, the matter to be referred to one of the fudges of the Supreme Court as provided by that Order in Conneil. By this means the continenty of the present Commission would be pre-- served and the Indians would have a quarantee that the same policy which has hither to guided the Commission in dealing with their Reserves would be continued in the future. Moreover the experience acquired during the past 18 months would enable
