The Governor General in Council.

The Department of Public Highways of the province of Saskatchewan has applied to the Department of Indian Affairs for a right of way for a surveyed road, containing 2.64 acres, through the S.E. 1/4 Section 5, Township 19, Range 5, W. 2 N., being part of the Kawawista-haw Indian reserve No. 72A, in the province of Saskatchewan, the said right of way being shown on plan of survey made by K. N. Crowther, D.L.S., dated 14th December 1922, a copy of which is recorded in the Surveys Branch of the Department of Indian Affairs under Number Rd. 2056.

The said right of way replaces and for the greater part coincides with a roadway previously reserved by the Department for the province. This latter roadway is shown on plan of survey by W.T. Thompson, D.L.S., dated 7th April, 1905, a copy of which is recorded in the Surveys Branch of the Department of Indian Affairs under No. 713. As the province relinquishes all claim to the last mentioned roadway, it is considered the transfer may be made without compensation.

The undersigned would accordingly recommend that under Section 46 of the Indian Act as amended by Section 1 of Chap. 14, 1-2 George V, the above mentioned lands be herewith transferred to the Department of Highways of the province of Saskatchewan for road purposes.
