To the Secretary Dept. of Indian Affairs, Ottawa,

Sir,

In answer to your letter of the 4th inst., I beg to inform you that a Reserve can now be appropriated for the Indians at Manouan Lake and that it can be located at the point indicated on the small plan (blue print) annexed to your letter of the 28th January 1904 and laid out in the manner you speak of: two miles frontage on the Manouan River and one mile in depth. The area would therefore be equal to 1280 acres.

I beg to draw your attention to the fact that, after this Reserve is made, there will remain only 1207 acres out of the 230000 acres of land set apart and appropriated under the Statute 14 & 15 Vict. Chap. 106 for the benefit the Indian Tribes in Lower Canada, as the area of land now remaining to be appropriated in virtue of said Statute, is 2487 acres.
