S1r,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letters of the 21st and 30th ultimo, reporting applications for permission to out timber on the Reserve for sale, and in reply to state that these applications should be in the form of resolutions passed by the Band at a regular meeting, and the number of pieces and the kinds of wood should have been specifically stated.

The Department is unable to consider what is meant by the general terms used.

You may give permits to members of the Band to out 200 pieces of boom timber and 1,000 railway ties, subject to payment of dues under sworn returns.

You should see that the highest prices are obtained for the Indians.
