MEMORANDUM FOR MR. HEENEY

SECRET

I am attaching, herewith, a copy of a secret memorandum prepared by the Dominions Office on the use of radio-telephone service under censorship, which is of interest.

The situation here at the moment is that business calls may be put through to any point in Europe, except enemy or enemy occupied territory, via the New York - Amsterdam, New York - Geneva, or New York - London channels. These calls are, of course, subject to censorship. You will notice in the final paragraph of the attached memorandum it is suggested that commercial calls via these channels should not be permitted from Canada.

This is being drawn to the attention of the Censorship Authorities who will decide what action is necessary.
