Before the Assignment is accepted for registration under the Indian Act, the Assignee should be the informed that by reason of m decision in the Fisheries Case, the right to these Lots is not in the Department, and the Department cannot patent them without the consent of the Department of Marine & Fisheries, which has been applied for.
