Reference your letter of 24th ultimo re the visit of our Deputy Minister and Director to Kamloops. Chief C.R. Brown was duly appointed by the Lytton Council to represent them. Councilor Victor Adolph will represent the joint Fountain-Pavilion Bands, he is a member of the Fountain Council.

Councilor Henry Oleman will represent the Seton Lake Band, and Henry Thevarge the joint Bridge River-Cayoose Creek Bands. I have not received any reply from the Boothroyd Band, and shall visit the Chief today. If, as I suspect, most of the members of the Band are in the U.S.A., I would recommend that a representative be appointed for the Boston Bar Band.

I have advised those concerned that they will make their own transportation and hotel arrangements, keeping such receipts as are required, and they would be reimbursed. I have made my own hotel accommodation at Kamloops. I have assumed that the conference will start in the morning of July 22nd, therefore it will be necessary for those attending to be in Kamloops on the night of the 21st. The three representatives from the Lillooet area will travel by private car. I will be able to take the two representatives from the Lytton area in Departmental car.
