6. After the striker shall have made one run, if he start again he must touch the bowling-stump, and turn before the ball cross the play, to entitle him to another.
7. The striker shall be entitled to three runs for lost ball, and the same number for ball stopped with bat, with reference to the 28 th and 33 rd laws of double wicket.
8. When there shall be more than four players on a side, there shall be no bounds: all "hits," "byes," and "overthrows" will then be allowed.
9. The bowler is subject to the same laws as at double wicket.
10. No more than one minute shall be allowed between each two balls.
