

not be fined, and the Society will proceed to a new election.

ART. III. THAT any person intending to become a member of this Society, cannot be admitted under the age of twenty-one years, nor above forty-five, and must be proposed on a meeting night by a member, to be balloted for at the ensuing meeting, who shall declare him to be in perfect health to the best of his knowledge, and he shall pay to the Treasurer such sum or sums of money, as is at the time of his being proposed the fixed rate of admission. Should the Candidate be approved of by a regular ballot he will be received, and if not approved of the money to be returned; but should he be admitted and shall after that decline becoming a member, then the said sum or sums of money so paid to be forfeited to the Society.
