THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to privide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district In which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interfor, Ottawa, the Con-missioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is gituate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10,00 is charged for a homestead entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Daminion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:--

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

⁽⁹⁾ Futry must be made personally at the local land office for the dis let in which the land is situate.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the reouterments of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-ing patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be suitable by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same towa, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails hims of othering townsup. (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestend, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those only who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to are his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application 'or patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION.

INFORMATION, Newly arrived immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominian Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing land to suit there Full information respecting the laud, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Reit in British Columbia, may be obtained upon applica-tion to the Secretary of the Department of the Interfor, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoha, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitoba or the North-West Territories.
