BISHOPS CONDEMN MEASURE

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Dublin, May 15 .- Today in Ireland the outstanding Catholic crisis is the struggle for the schools. The number of Catholics in the country is over three and one quarter millions, or seventy five per cent. of the pupils on the primary school rolls is nearly 700,000 of whom seventy five per cent. are Catholic children. 
