The Clerk of the Legislative Council delivered, at the Bar of the House, the following Message:

The Legislative Council have passed the following Bills of their own, to which they

desire the concurrence of this House:

Bill, intituled, "An Act to facilitate the repression of the evils caused by intemper-

"ance in Lower Canada."

Bill, intituled, "An Act to amend the Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of Her "Majesty's reign, chaptered fifty-nine, intituled: 'An Act to incorporate the St. Lawrence "'Tow Boat Company;"'

And then he withdrew.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Solicitor General Langevin, seconded by the Honor-

able Mr. Solicitor General Cockburn;
Ordered, That the Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to facilitate "the repression of the evils caused by intemperance in Lower Canada," be now read the first time.

The Bill was accordingly read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time,

to-morrow.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Solicitor General Langevin, seconded by the Honor-

able Mr. Solicitor General Cockburn;

Ordered, That the Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to amend the "Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign, chaptered fifty-nine, intituled, "'An Act to incorporate the St. Lawrence Tow Boat Company,"' be now read the first time.

The Bill was accordingly read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time,

to-morrow.

The Honorable Mr. McDougall, one of Her Majesty's Executive Council, presented, pursuant to Addresses to His Excellency the Governor General,—Return to an Address of the Legislative Assembly, dated 20th June, 1866; for copies of correspondence respecting the Hamilton and Port Dover Road, since the sale of the said Road. (Sessional Papers, No. 34.)

Return to an Address of the Legislative Assembly, dated 14th June, 1866; for information respecting leaves of absence granted to Judges of Lower Canada, during the last three years, and relative to the holding of Courts. (Sessional Papers, No. 42.)

A Bill to confirm the settlement made by Charlotte Henderson, deceased, of an undivided moiety of lands in Bytown, otherwise Ottawa City, in the Province of Upper Canada, and to invest the entirety of the same lands in Trustees, with powers of sale and management, was, according to Order, read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

A Bill, intituled, "The Hamilton Debentures Act, 1866," was, according to Order,

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and the title be, "An Act to amend the City of "Hamilton Debentures Act, 1864, by giving to the City additional powers in selling lands " for arrears of taxes, and for more clearly defining the rights and liabilities of purchasers " of land sold under that Act, and for other purposes."

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their

concurrence.

A Bill to incorporate the Rossin House Hotel Company was, according to Order, read

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and the Title be, "An Act specially to incorporate "the Rossin House Hotel Company."
