

WOMAN WEIGHS 570 LBS. AT DEATH.

A victim of elephantitis, which there is said to be no cure, Mrs. Annie Frey, thirty-four years old, died late Tuesday night. At the time of her death she weighed 590 pounds.

Because of her weight, for eight months Mrs. Frey had been unable to leave her bedroom, the door being too narrow. When she retired it required the efforts of nine persons to lift her into bed.

For the burial on Saturday an undertaker has constructed a special coffin and it will be necessary to reinforce a hearse to carry the body to the cemetery. In order to get the coffin from the apartment which is on an upper floor, one of the windows has been torn out and a derrick will be erected upon the roof to swing the coffin to the ground.

Five years ago Mrs. Frey weighed 140 pounds. From some infection, believed to be the bite of an insect, she contracted elephantitis and began to increase in weight. She went to Bellevue Hospital for treatment several times, but failed to be cured.—Ex.

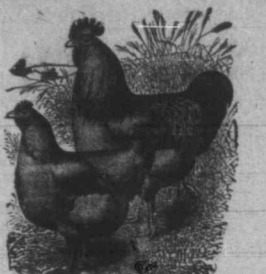
