ALL DAY RIOT.

Fight For Double Fare to Coney Island Causes Much Trouble.

New York, Aug. 14.—Riots and disorder prevailed along the trolley lines to Coney Island Sunday when the Brooklyn Rapid Transit, in defiance of Judge Gaynor's decision, undertook to collect two fares to seaside resorts.

Thousands of persons were pulled from the cars by the railroad company's inspectors and fully fifty thousand walked to Coney Island rather than submit to the company's demands. Other thousands who undertook to walk to Brooklyn spent the night sleeping by the tracks.

The police, who had interfered during the day only to prevent disorder, at night took command and for a time kept the cars moving so rapidly that the inspectors could not eject passengers. Later, however, the motormen declined to move the cars and the police arrested several of them for obstructing the street.

The conduct of the riot was in progress from early morning Sunday until early yesterday, along the main lines of travel. As a result of it two women were injured, one so seriously that she may die; another woman and a child came so near death that hundreds of on-lookers turned their faces away in horror; innumerable persons were bruised and several were arrested on charges of assault.

The first steps have been taken in scores of damage suits.

C. P. R. DIVIDENDS.

Fiscal Year Returns of the Big Canadian Railway Corporation.

Montreal, Aug. 14.—At a meeting of the directors of the Canadian Pacific Railway Co. yesterday, a dividend of 2 per cent. on the preferred stock for the half year ended June 30 last was declared. A dividend of 3 per cent. for the same period was also declared on the common stock.

MILLIONAIRE INSOLENCIE.

New York and Pittsburgh New Rich Rough It at Beaumaris, Muskoka.

Braebridge, Muskoka, Aug. 14.—The escapades of a party of New York and Pittsburgh millionaires at the Royal Muskoka Hotel a few nights ago were revealed in the "Police Court" here, a couple of days ago, when Police Magistrate Spencer convicted Pergus Haynes of New York and E. Rafferty and Henry Dallmeyer of Pittsburgh on separate charges of disorderly conduct and bathing off the wharf in nature's garb.

Owing to the prominence of the parties and the appeal of Manager Boomer of the Royal Muskoka for a light sentence, the magistrate imposed no fine, but allowed a conviction to stand over the accused and compelled them to pay the costs of the prosecution. The excitement of the affair, and the probability that the exuberant millionaires would return, caused the illness of several of the ladies, and the guests insisted on the manager taking action, as above, in the criminal courts.

PURSUED SEVEN DAYS.

One of Assaults of Elizabeth Bradley Captured by Constable.

Walkerton, Aug. 14.—After a chase of seven days, Samuel Sturgeon, alleged to be one of the assaults of Elizabeth Bradley, who was outraged a week ago in Kincardine Township, has been captured near Tara by County Constable Hodgins of Kincardine.

Sturgeon was identified by the girl as one of the three men who had outraged her, but the other two men wanted are still at large. They are Neil and Murdoch McLeod, brothers.

Ever since word of the outrage came County Constable Hodgins has pursued the three men, and for seven days and seven nights he had been relentless in his chase across the rough, rocky country of Bruce Peninsula.

Mr. Bastedo Selected.

Toronto, Aug. 14.—A despatch was received in the city last night from Winnipeg stating that Mr. S. T. Bastedo of this city, formerly Provincial Deputy Commissioner of Fisheries, has been appointed Ontario manager for the Annuity Co. of Canada. The organization, a recent one, was incorporated under a Federal charter, has a capital of \$1,000,000, and the promoter and managing director is Mr. G. J. Lovell of Winnipeg.

Former Canadian Dies Abroad.

Detroit, Mich., Aug. 14.—Michael Dowling, a former well-known attorney in Detroit and Bay City, and an ex-member of the Michigan State Legislature, is dead here, aged 73 years. Mr. Dowling was born in Toronto and resided there until he was 21 years of age.

Belligerents Burn Town.

Sofia, Aug. 14.—Advices were received here yesterday from Ahlou, where the Greeks and Bulgarians have been fighting to the effect that a large part of the town has been destroyed by fire. The Greek metropolitan is said to have perished in the flames.

Want Canadian Beef.

Ottawa, Aug. 14.—The Department of Agriculture has received from the military authorities at Malta forms of tender for the supply of fresh meat and live cattle to that district for 12 months, commencing 1st January, 1907.

ZORAYA DEFEATS IROQUOIS.

Canadian Yacht Lifts the Fisher Cup For the First Time.

Rochester, Aug. 14.—In a light sailing breeze from the northeast, which at no time during the race blew more than six miles an hour, the Toronto yacht Zoraya defeated the Rochester yacht Iroquois yesterday, and the Fisher Cup went to the Royal Canadian Yacht Club for the first time.

For fourteen years the Rochester Yacht Club has held this trophy, winning it in 1892 from the Belleville Yacht Club with the cutter Onward, and successfully defended it in 1900 with the Genesee against the Toronto yacht Minota. The race yesterday transfers the cup to the Canadians, and they have fairly earned it.
