HANGING OF EGYPTIANS

Details of the Executions By British Officials Which Followed Signs of Unrest In Egypt.

The London, Eng., News has received a long account of the Denshawal affair, addressed "to the English nation" from "Young Egyptians." The

on June 13, 1906, a simple incident On June 13, 1906, a simple incident occurred, the issues of which were, as a matter of fact, a hard blow on the hearts of the Egyptians. When first rumored, it was felt sadly by Egyptians, not because it is uncommon, as many incidents of the same nature take place amongst natives, but because it is attached to a foreign element. Europeans, being uninitiated in the language and conduct of the Egyptians Fellah, considered the act as being of greatest importance. This misunderstanding may lead them to lose their confidence in Egyptians, which would affect the relations between the two parties, relations which we are doing our best to strengthen, improve and maintain. For we all believe that so doing we will benefit ourselves.

They then go on to give a detailed account of the visit of the British officers to the village to shoot pigeons, and ascribe the unfortunate events which followed to misunderstanding of the language of the country on the part of the officers.

The document ends up with a graphic description of the flogging of the natives, as follows:

The ministry of interior erected the instruments of execution in a square of 2,100 square metres, by the side of the village. In the centre of the square the gallows was erected. About 10 metres from the gallows a tent was pitched for the purpose of washing the dead bodies of the condemned to death. On the northern side of the square two other tents were demned to death. On the northern side of the square two other tents were pitched for the condemned to death and flogging respectively. At 1 o'clock p.m. the prisoners arrived, handcuffed and leg-ironed, guarded all round by the British cavalry of the Dragoons, with their rifles at their backs and their bayonets at hands. They were followed by the Egyptian cavalry. Prisoners were then taken into their respective tents, and the soldiers surrounded the square.

Mr. Machell and the Mudir of Minofiah stood between the gallows and scaffold. The son of Hassan Mahfooz, one of the condemned to death, asked to see his father before hanging, but was not allowed by Mr. Machell. At 1.30 p.m. orders were given through the trumpet, and the soldiers mounted their horses and drew their swords. A minute after, the first man condemned to death was taken out of the tent. He is 65 years old, and against whom no charge was proved, but then he said to Major P., "Don't shoot near the village!" After hearing the minutes of the judgment read to him by the mudir, the executioner tied his hands and took him up to the gallows. With his face towards the village, His wife, sons and relations were on the roofs of his very near house, and as soon as they saw him ascending cried bitterly and bitter! A few seconds later the man was hung with his eyes facing it also. This was purposely done.

done.

Then the first condemned to flogging Then the first condemned to flogging was taken out while his comrade was still hung on the gallows. When he saw him his knees staggered and shook terribly from the awful sight. The soldiers undressed and tied him against the scaffold with his back towards the village, as his friend was facing it also. This was purposely done to make the children and all villagers in general feel the terrible execution. The soldiers then began to flog him on his bare skin, each lash leaving the blood clotted in its place. The man cried loudly, and called out for rescue. His villagers on the roofs were seeing the execution, and no one of them but was absolutely affected by the awful sight of execution performed by members of the civilized world. Amongst the spectators Europeans wept and showed a kind feeling towards those unfortunate creatures.

As soon as the man received the twentieth lash he lost his senses, and his whole body was set into convulsions. After receiving the fiftieth he was borne to his comrades in the tent

Another one condemned to flogging was taken out and lashed in the same way whitst the person hung was yet on the gallows.

Similarly every one condemned to death remained hung on the gallows until two condemned to flogging were lashed after seeing him. Thus the execution was carried out in such a barbarous way which no creature in the civilized days ever sighted. After the execution lamentations were the fate of the mourning villagers!

Besides these calamities, the ministry of interior took illegal measures to inflict a punishment upon the whole population of Denshawal.

General disappointment prevailed amongst all the enlightened class of the Egyptians when they came to know that the judgment was based upon the idea of fanaticism and obstinacy of the nation. The sentence in itself and the way of execution were as cruel and barbarous as possible, and were, we are glad to say, profoundly rebuked by the English themselves in Parliament, who were quieted only when they heard the words of Sir Edward Grey accusing the Egyptians of fanaticism.

Imagine, then, what effects have had the sentence and execution upon the minds of those who believe that the incident was only a matter of misunderstanding on the part of both parties!


