

Toronto, Nov. 28.—September earnings on the T. & N. O. were \$43,428, and the expenses \$31,816, leaving \$11,612 net earnings. The percentage of operating expenses is thus 73.03, about 20 per cent. above normal.

The total earnings for the year up till Sept. 30 were \$388,300, and the expenses \$243,789, leaving net \$144,511. Last year the net amount for the same period was \$71,342.

The train mileage for 1906 so far has been 23,344, as against 12,030 last year. Part of the increase comes from the extension of the road to Engle-hart.
