

A few weeks ago it was st

that Dr. Baxter was experiming with a silo at his farm the McLaughlin Road. Yes day, the weather being fine mild, the doctor fulfilled promise to drive a TIMES ren ter out to his farm, to see w he was doing and to learn so thing about the Ensilage tem. The farm is convenie situated on the McLiug Road, about a mile and a from the town, being a pleasant fitteen minutes d from the Doctor's office. It gins at a point about 300 v the other side of the Rural etery property, and exte along the main road about mile, varying in depth about 110 rods to perhaps rods at the narrowest point. land was purchased by the tor two years ago, at which it was entirely covered wi thick growtn of bushes trees. The fact that the dist had been burnt over al twenty-five years and that s a thich growth of new to consisting for the most part birch and juniper. had s sprung up was of ifself evide of the richness of the soil, strange to say very little of land on either side of the roa cleared or cultivated. The tor took his choice of locat however and went to work va will. Though he had li time to devote to superinter ing the work, last year he some 50 acres chopped and spring he got from 15 to acres under crop, in oats, toes and Southern corn. potatoes did not turn out as t should have done, the everywhere being a failure, he will probably have bushels. From a barrel of a variety sent him by a frien Nova Scotia, the return is a tweney fold, but all the o varieties were far below an dinary yield. Of oats he probably 150 or 175 bushels it is of the corn we would so particularly and of the SYSTEM OF ENSILAGE.

The doctor planted a patch, not more than a third an acre, with "Blunt's Proli a variety of Southern corn,h ly recommended for ensil purposes, owing to the lux ant goth.
