## Ninety Thousand Are Dying Every Year.

### FATE OF NON-BELIEVERS.

"How Shall the Heathen be Saved?" was the subject used by Pastor A. H. MacMillan, of New York City, in his lecture at the British Hall, yesterday afternoon. He said in part:

"According to statistics furnished by the British and United States Governments, the heathen have increased from six hundred millions to twelve hundred millions during the past century, and are now dying at the rate of 90,000 every twenty-four hours in Christless despair. When we consider this appalling condition after one hundred years of unparalleled Missionary efforts, the questions naturally arise in our minds, will the world ever be converted, and where will this vast multitude of human beings spend eternity?"

He then referred to the conditions in Christian lands quoting from Church statistics in America to show that the Church was not strong enough to convert the heathen, and that if it ever would be done we must look to a higher power than we now possess. At this point he quoted many texts from the Bible to prove that God has the power and desire to convert the world. He then introduced the question: "In view of the fact that God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son to die for the human race, and that He is Almighty, why has He not exercised this power in behalf of the heathen to the end that they might be enlightened?"

"The Bible," said he, "furnishes the only satisfactory answer to this question, viz., the time for God to carry out this feature of His great plan for man's salvation has not yet come. God is a God of order, and has a 'due time' for everything, and the Bible points out that the present age is devoted to the selection of the Church, a little flock in all, from all nations of the earth, and these when glorified with Christ will reign with Him 1,000 years, during which time the world will be converted. For Scriptural evidence on this point see the following texts: Acts 15:14-17; Luke 12:22; Rev. 20:6; Jer. 31:31-34; Hag. 2:14.

"During this 1,000 year reign of Christ and the Church, Satan will be bound and his present influence over the human race will be taken away

(Rev. 20:1-3). Then the work of destroying evil will go on without opposition. Then the knowledge of the Lord will fill the earth as the waters cover the sea, and all will know the Lord from the least to the greatest.

"Those saved during this reign of Christ will not die and go to Heaven, but will be restored to human perfection, as Adam was in the beginning, and will find their Heaven here on earth. St. Peter says that all the holy prophets of God referred to that time when they foretold the restoration of all things; see Acts 3:19-21. The whole earth will then be made like the Garden of Eden, and the countless millions of heathen who have died in ignorance, will be brought back from the sleep of death, as Ezekiel says in the 16th chapter and 5th verse, 'they will return to their former estate,' and then they will receive their first and only opportunity for salvation, which will consist of restoration to human perfection.

"At the end of this thousand-year reign of Christ, which accomplishes this restoration, Satan will be loosed out of his prison to test those restored ones. Some of them he will deceive and lead astray, as he did Adam and Eve. These, together with Satan will be destroyed in the 'lake of fire,' which is a symbol of the second death." See Rev. 20:15. Jesus will then deliver up the Kingdom to God, who will turn it over to Adam and his race, for whom it was originally intended as stated in Isaiah 45:17-18; Matt. 25:34; 1 Cor. 15:25-28. Then God's great plan in respect to this world will have been proven to be in harmony with His great attributes of Love, Justice, Wisdom and Power, and Christ's mission to earth a complete success, for, said He, I came to save THAT which was lost. (Matt. 18:11.)

## STATEMENT MADE BY EDWIN BOWER HESSER.

Opera Impresario Announces Extra Opera Performance of "Il Trovatore" as Wednesday Matinee.

Edwin Bower Hesser, the opera impresario, arrived on Saturday, and is staying at Waterford Hall. He made the journey to Newfoundland from Boston expressly to attend the first grand operatic presentation in the history of the colony, which will start to-night at the Total Abstinence Hall (Casino Theatre). Mr. Hesser made the following statement to the Evening Telegram.

"Through a misunderstanding the general public has received the impression that the Grand Opera Festival would take place on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights, whereas I had planned that the festival be on Monday and Tuesday nights and Wednesday afternoon, the company to leave St. John's on the 6 o'clock train on Wednesday. But to keep faith with the expectations of the opera season subscribers I have cancelled the Friday night engagement in Sydney, and will play the three nights here. The opera 'Don Pasquale' has been abandoned as far as this tour is concerned, and the much more wonderful 'I Pagliacci' substituted. Thus 'Cavalleria Rusticana' will be sung Monday night, 'La Traviata' Tuesday night and 'I Pagliacci' on Wednesday night.

Wednesday afternoon being a holiday, I have decided to give a gala performance of "Il Trovatore" on that day. "Il Trovatore" is one of the most glorious of all operas, and
