The extent of the German losses i the recent deseprate fighting along the Aisne was partially disclosed by a reference in to-day's official statenent of the capture of 130 guns, of which a considerable number were of heavy calibre. The German losses in nen are estimated at more than 200,-000, with a probability that the total eached 235,000. These figures include killed, wounded and prisoners, the nidable totals of the present war.
The number of German prisoners agarded, gregates approximately 20,000.
