

takers of beautiful St. Sophia. Until the Turks gained possession of it they were always going to effect repairs, and never doing it. As a matter of fact, the stone cannon balls can still be seen imbedded in the crumbling walls where they lodg-ed in the assault of 1453. The marble veneering, feet thick in places, has been stolen for other purposes, even some of its carved stones have been quarried away from its walls.

And the great fane, priceless link between the ancient Greek, the Roman, Latin and later Christianity is sinking. Its mighty pillars are actually out of plumb now, builders will know what that means!

Turkey will never do anything to-wards saving it from ruin, that is certain. It would require more money than that broken down country could raise—despoiled as it has been by Germany-to underpin and shore up that mighty building.

The sooner it is taken over by the League of Nations to a commission or body of some kind or another, to look after it, the better.
