He has repeated here the same stunt that he did in Canada, when in this far-flung continent there was some uncertainty about its future connection with the British Empire. Excepting the railroad strike in New Zealand, the Prince met a supergenerous treatment everywhere, even radical Queensland outdoing itself. Statesmen, laborers, sheep herders and thousands of soldiers cheered the "Digger Prince." He has proven himself the most valuable asset of the Empire, cementing the cracks in the Dominion's alliances. The "Smiling Prince's" visit has added a human touch to relations with the overseas Dominions.
