### "Prince of Pilsen."

FINAL PERFORMANCE A GREAT

Mr. Gerald Foley, master of "props," the dancing of Mrs. Cleary's clever pupils, and the scenic designs of Mr. Dan Carroll, all added tremendously to the success of the show and cannot be over praised.
