### Archbishop Calls Valera Foe of Irish.

#### BALTIMORE PRELATE DECLARES THE LEADER OF IRREGULARS IS IRELAND'S GREATEST MENACE.

(New York Times.)

Archbishop Michael J. Curley of Baltimore, has returned on a trip to Europe, accompanied by Mgr. L. R. Stickey, rector of the Cathedral of Baltimore, and the Rev. Patrick Healey, D.D., Professor of History in the Catholic University of America. The party visited Naples, Rome, where the Archbishop was received by the Pope at the Vatican, and then traveled through France to England and Athlone, Ireland, to visit the Archbishop's aged mother. The Archbishop met John McCormack at Athlone, and said the Irish tenor was in fine health and voice and would return to America in October.

When asked his opinion on the existing conditions in Ireland, the Archbishop dictated the following statement:

"In Ireland there is an Irish Government functioning, with back of this Government 95 per cent. or more of the Irish people. There is nothing more evident in Ireland to-day than that the Irish people want the peace treaty and the Free State status. Ninety-five per cent. of the men who fought the Black and Tans are with the people and are being guided by the will of the people. In other words, Irish Ireland is thoroughly democratic.

### Will it Rain?

In different localities the weather varies so much that the official weather forecasts are only of general application. Here is a simple and reliable way of telling if rain is coming during the day.

As early as possible in the morning go out and search the sky for the smallest cloud that is in sight. Keep this under close observation for five minutes or so and note whether it alters in size. If the cloud gets smaller one can be almost certain of a fine day. On the other hand, if it increases in size, rain will surely come in a few hours.

Where the cloud remains the same size no special change in the prevailing weather is likely to take place. If the cloud increases very rapidly thunder is almost a certainty in the summer.

Alteration in the size of clouds is connected with the state of the atmosphere. When the air is very dry and rain is unlikely, the clouds soon vanish; if the atmosphere is charged with moisture the clouds will increase and this will soon be discharged in the form of rain.

The contract for the erection of the Normal School in St. John's has been secured by the Howwood Lumber Co. The cost, it is said, will be \$200,000. The building has to be completed in 1923.
