THE WOOL MARKET.—Since last week's quotations there has been a rise in the price of wool in our market. The figures now vary from 35c to 36c, a few exceptional lots bringing 37c. On Wednesday over 5,000 lbs. changed hands, on Tuesday about 3,000, and on Monday about 400 lbs. were sold. The demand is brisk.
