Saturday night.

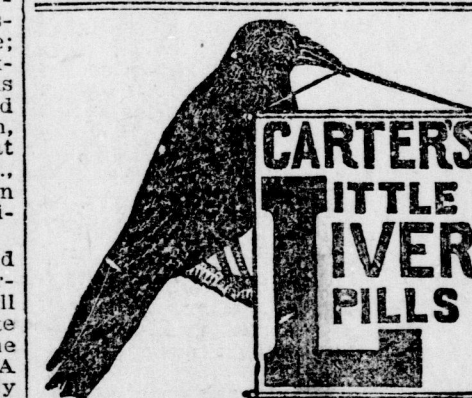
