FIGHTING IN BLUEFIELD.

The Place Retaken by the Nicaraguans.

The Mosquito Flag Replaced by the British.

LONDON, Aug. 14 - A dispatch to the Times from Port Limon, Costa Rica, dated Aug. 12, says: The British cruiser Mohawk has arrived here from the Mosquito country with Chief Clarence and 112 refugees aboard.

Bluefield was retaken by 2,000 Nicaraguans, who arrived from Rama and Greytown aboard transports flying the United States flag.

The American marines re-embarked on their approach, abandoning the American residents, many of whom removed the national flag from their houses and hoisted the British flag.

The Nicaraguan officials on entering the Government House hauled down and tore into shreds the Mosquito flag and arrested numerous Americans and Jamaicans suspected of sympathizing with Chief Clarence.

Capt. Stewart, of the Mohawk, went into the prison and rescued those who were willing to claim British protection.

The Mohawk remains at Port Limon, awaiting orders from Great Britain. Chief Clarence is still aboard the Mohawk.

HEROINE AND VILLAIN. While a Landlady Was Rescuing the Immates a Sneak Stole Her Money.

MARINE CITY, Mich., Aug. 14 - The Hotel Wesott, a three-story frame building, took fire at 3 o'clock this morning. The interior of the hotel was ruined, except the parlor on the second floor. All the rooms were occupied, mostly by commercial travelers, some of whom narrowly escaped in their night clothes.

Mr. Campbell, the proprietor, was out of town, but his wife took all the occupants, and did not leave the building until every one had escaped, she being the last to leave.

While Mrs. Campbell was rousing the people somebody went into her room and stole about \$50.
