RAILWAY BUILDER PASSES Stanton, Who Projected the Canada Atlantic, Dies at New York.

New York, July 18.—Daniel N. Stanton, a contractor, who was identified with the construction work on several railroads in the east, died yesterday at his home here. Mr. Stanton was born in Bartlett, N. H., 81 years ago. He entered the railroad construction business at the age of sixteen years when the Boston, Concord and Montreal railroad was being built.
