Petrograd, Jan. 20 .- An official communication issued by the grand staff of the Russian army indicates considerable activity and fighting on the right bank of the Lower Vistula. The statement follows:

"During the 17th and 18th of January on the right bank of the Lower Vistula, upon the front running from the river to the railroad from Warsaw to Mlawa a portion of our troops, having come in close contact with the enemy, had a series of collisions of secondary import
