MIDDLE-AGED MEN
PUT TO TEST WITH
THE YOUNG FELLOWS

Unique Efficiency Experiment
Started by Chicago
Employers.

Chicago, Dec. 8.—The tests of the efficiency of men between the ages of 45 and 65 alongside of an equal number of young men were started today by a committee of fifteen large employers recently organized, with Benjamin J. Rosenthal, a Chicago capitalist, at its head.

The committee was organized primarily, Mr. Rosenthal said, to "upset" a common theory that men between the ages of 45 and 65 are fit only for the "scrap heap."

In response to advertisements in the newspapers several hundred applications for the experiment were received by the committee, and a large force of clerks, loaned by business houses today began to sift and classify them.

A Work Test.
"Twenty middle-aged men whom we have selected will be employed by one of the largest houses in Chicago," said Mr. Rosenthal. "The head of the house, to make an efficiency test, will put them to work on a piece of machinery, alongside of them will be twenty young men, and each individual will be given the same work to do. They will be doing the same work."

"If these twenty middle-aged men do half as much work as the younger men, they will be paid half as much. If their efficiency is equal to the younger men they will receive the same salary."

"Recently I took a score of experienced middle-aged men and put them to wrapping parcels in a large concern beside twenty young men. The older men did as much work as the younger, and in some instances more."

FIRE UPON BY SUB,
BUT MAKES ESCAPE

Two Members of Caloric's Crew Killed by Germans.

London, Dec. 8.—1:30 p.m.—The Norwegian steamship Caloric, on her voyage from the United States to Scandinavian ports, was fired upon by a German submarine and two members of her crew were killed, says a dispatch from Copenhagen to the Exchange Telegraph Company. The Caloric escaped undamaged.

The Caloric is a tank steamer of 7,013 tons gross. The vessel left Port Arthur, N. S. W., on Oct. 15, and Norfolk October 21, for Darinmouth, England, according to the latest maritime records. The ship was built in 1914, and is owned at Bergen, Norway.

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The Porcupine gold production of 1914 was \$5,190,794, which increased to \$7,580,766 in 1915, and will, for 1916, amount to over \$10,000,000.

The bulk of this production was from the so-called Hollinger section of the camp, in which is located the Thompson-Krist property.

This production has been obtained from workings which are all above the 700-foot levels of the mines.

The Hollinger has proven in workings high values at 1,450 feet, and by drills, values at 2,200 feet. One of the greatest ore bodies of the McIntyre is at 1,000 feet. The Porcupine Crown is taking out richer ores at 900 feet than at any higher levels.

These properties all adjoin the Thompson-Krist, save the McIntyre, which is not far distant.

LONDON HAS GIVEN
OVER \$45,000 FOR

The local market today was a small one, but fairly large one is expected for Saturday. Hay was plentiful this morning, but steady in price at \$12 to \$12.50 a ton. Straw was unchanged at \$9.50 to \$10 a ton. Oats dropped still further, selling for \$2 to \$2.25 a cwt. Wheat sold for \$1.70 a bushel for new, and \$1.60 a bushel for old.

Potatoes were steady, but there are indications of still lower prices. They sold at \$2.10 to \$2.25 a bag. Parsnips are bringing from \$1 to \$1.10 a bushel, and turnips from 50c to 60c. Spinach sells for 75c a bushel, carrots for 90c to \$1, and dry onions for \$2.25 to \$2.50 a bushel.

Apples are bringing from 90c to \$1.25 a bushel, and crabapples \$1 a bushel. Pears are still for sale at \$1 to \$1.25 a bushel.

Dairy prices are steady, creamery butter retailing for 48c to 50c a pound; butter in rolls, for 45c to 48c a pound, and dairy butter, in crocks, for 45c a pound. Eggs are selling for \$1.25 each, turkeys at 27c to 28c a pound, and geese at 17c a pound.

Live hogs are firm at \$10.50 to \$10.75 a cwt. Fat sows are higher at \$8.25 a cwt. Dressed hogs are unchanged at \$14 a cwt. Veal is selling for \$15 to \$16 a cwt, and beef for \$9 to \$11.50 a cwt. Hides are unchanged in price.

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WALL STREET

New York, Dec. 8.—Wall Street 10:30 a.m.—The course of prices during today's early dealings indicate some consolidation of speculative sentiment. Claims of substantial proportions were numerous, but these were neutralized by moderate recessions in metals and some of the utilities, equipments and specialities as United States Rubber, American Industrial, Atlantic, Gulf and West Indies continued its rise, advancing 6 points to 142, a new record. United States Steel and allied shares, like Crucible and Lackawanna, were steady. Steel and Republic, were appreciably better. Reading and Southern Railway, common and preferred, featured the strong rally.

No demand for stocks divided after the first hour, the turn-over being almost the lightest in many weeks. Steel, Reading and other leaders needed a point or more to hold their position. Some of the other investment issues were moderately active. Utilities displayed marked weakness, Ohio Gas making an extreme decline of almost 12 points, but recovering half its loss. Copper, Central Leather and Continental Can also gave way to pressure. Advances in American Rubber, International Paper and Securities excited little interest. Bonds were irregular.

After a substantial rally from the recent low levels, the market today showed hesitancy, buying orders evidently not following the market on this rally. This would be brought about by the views recently expressed that the scaling market may be looked for within a fairly long range. At this level the market might be said to be a two-sided affair. There is a sufficient bear sentiment to bring about opposition on the advance. The next move of importance will likely develop as soon as sentiment has established around a particular figure for the Government estimate next Monday. The New York Cotton Exchange, usually the agricultural report of the size of the crop, will play a part until after the 15th of the month, when the attitude on the part of the scaling market will be more definitely indicated.
