

Fred St. Lawrence, secretary of the D. S. Perrin & Co., Ltd., of this city, addressed' the grocers on the sales tax and the manner in which it affected the retail grocer. He explained to them that it was the desire of the manufacturers that the government collect the sales tax directly from them, instead of from the retail grocer, as the case is at present. By so doing, he stated, bookkeeping ex nenses would be decreased consider.

Secured Compromise.

He pointed out that a short while ago he had gone to Ottawa and had interviewed the government on the matter. His visit was a partial success, as the minister of finance compromised, and with the result half the sales tax is now collected from manufacturing concerns, and the \$500,000 BUILDING other half from the retail grocer.

However, the grocers are dissatisfied with the new legislation, and as the manufacturers are equally anxious that all the tax be collected from them, the protest was sent by the Western Ontario Retail Grocers' Association to Ottawa.


