MILLIONS FACE DEATH IN CHINA

15,000,000 Face Death Prospect and 45,000,000 Others Affected.

New York, Jan. 15.—Famine through China will claim more lives in the next six months than were lost in all the armies during the war, unless other nations come to the rescue on a tremendous scale, so it was predicted today by the Rev. Dr. W. A. Mather, Presbyterian missionary, upon his return from Peking.

"More than 15,000,000 persons face immediate prospect of starvation," he said, "and 45,000,000 others are affected in the famine zone of 100,000 square miles."

New York, Jan. 15.—More than 20,000 Armenian refugees in the Yars and Alexandropolis districts are dying because of lack of food and fuel, and anarchy stalks among them, stated latest advices from Armenia, by way of Paris received here yesterday by the Near East relief.

Married Women's Union. If a proposal that is under consideration in the east end of London comes to fruition, there will shortly be formed a union which will undoubtedly become the most powerful in the world, says Spare Moments.

It is a union of married women, many of whom are earning high wages, more than pre-war allowances to be contemplated co-operation to help upon receiving a minimum of two-thirds the earnings for household expenses. Stringent rules will be framed and those men who do not want to join the union will be asked to leave. If they do not, they will be asked to leave.

It will be a democratic union, and women of all stations of life will be invited to join. When a strike is declared every member will be ordered to "down tools" until the strike is ended. The union will not be permitted without the consent of the Women's Union Leaders, as the women know from experience that they are the greatest sufferers from strikes.

We fear the scheme is too Utopian for accomplishment, but once the ball is set rolling few married women will refuse to join. The power it will wield is beyond comprehension. In the matter of a Post Office, they have petitioned again and again, but always something crops up to squash the reality. The settlers having to come to Campbellton a distance of over three miles.
