The call of Rev. George McKay to Sunderland and Vroomanton in Lindsay Presbytery sesterday. Mr. McKay has accepted the call and will be released from his present charge on April 16.

The report of the Temperance Committee created considerable discussion. A clause reflecting on the Anglican and Roman Catholic churches because of their alleged apathy on the question of probibition was struck out. Forty-two out of 50 sessions reported on the temperance question; 22 of those favored total probibition. Two churches were undecided as to the best means of dealing with the liquor traffic. Central Church would have the Government sell all iquors in preference to our present license system, but think prohibition better still. The report was finally adopted. A memorial from the Prison Reform Association was read and endorsed by the Presbytery. Dr. Parsons' report con Sabbath observance resulted in the appointment of a committee to confer with the railways respecting unnecessary Sabbath gafile.
