## THE APPROACHING PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION.

Our readers are doubtless aware that the next annual Exhibition of the Agricultural Association of Upper Canada will take place at Brockville, on the 24th, 25th and 26th of September; when a large gathering is confidently anticipated.

The local Committee are actively engaged in preparing the ground which is situated on an eminence, but a few minutes walk from the steam-boat landing, and commanding extensive and picturesque views of the St. Lawrence, with its numerous islands, and the surrounding country. Arrangements have been made with steamboat proprietors on the lake and river to carry passengers at half price, (meals extra) and the same has been done with the Ogdensburgh railway, and also, we believe, with the lines that connect with it. A large number of American visitors is expected, with stock, implements, &c. and the same observation applies to Lower Canada; Brockville being very conveniently situated as regards that section of the Province.
