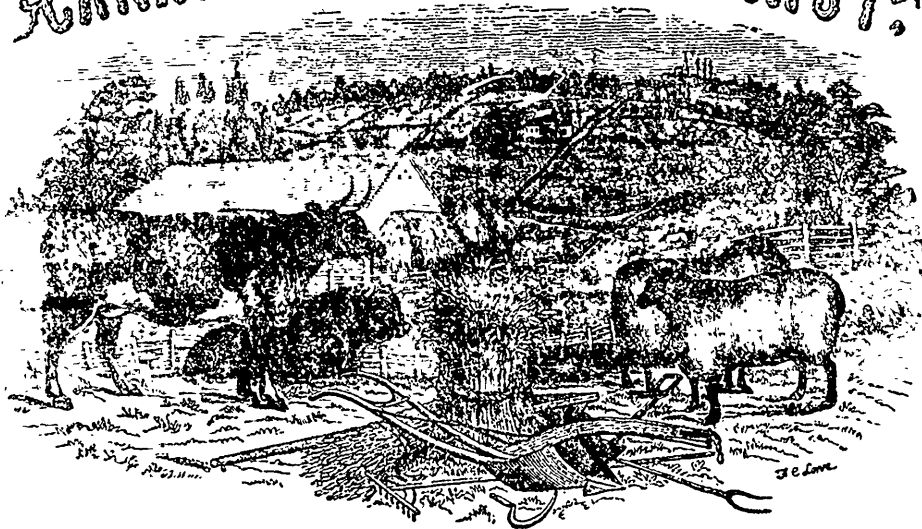

THE APPROACHING PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION.

Our readers are doubtless aware that the next
annual Exhibition of the Agricultural Associa-
tion of Upper Canada will take place at Brock-
ville, on the 24th, 25th and 26th of September;
when a large gathering is confidently anticipated.

The local Committee are actively engaged in
preparing the ground which is situated on an
eminence, but a few minutes walk from the
steam-boat landing, and commanding extensive
and picturesque views of the St. Lawrence, with
its numerous islands, and the surrounding coun-
try. Arrangements have been made with steam-
boat proprietors on the lake and river to carry
passengers at half price, (meals extra) and the
same has been done with the Ogdensburgh rail-
way, and also, we believe, with the lines that
connect with it. A large number of American
visitors is expected, with stock, implements, &c.
and the same observation applies to Lower Ca-
nada; Brockville being very conveniently situa-
ted as regards that section of the Province.
Stock, implements, &c., from the United States
for the purpose of exhibition, will be admitted
duty free, and every facility will be given for the
