great Head of the Church, "all whose ways are truth and paths judgment."

"They desire also to express their deep sympathies with the relatives of the deceased, and pray that grace sufficient may be imparted to comfort and sustain them under their trying dispensations."

Salaries.

Motior.

Took up the various subjects of reference. First, the Board recommend that the salaries of Missionaries be raised to the amount paid by the London Missionary Society. and the Reformed Presbyterian Church, viz., £120 sterling, to include all contingencies and incidental expenses, to commence from their landing on the Island. The recommendation was adopted.

Income of Mis-Sccondly.—What means should be taken to increase the number of sionaries. Missionaries? That the matter be remitted to the committee.

Time of sailing Thirdly.—The time of the sailing of the Mission Schooner. The of schooner, matter was remitted to the Foreign Mission Board.

- Thanks to Mr. Fourthly.—Agreed unanimously that the Synod record their thanks to Tucker. — Tucker, Esq., Lloyds agent, for his kindness in gratuitously surveying the Mission Schooner, and granting a certificate with the view to her being classed at Lloyds, and the Clerk was instructed to communicate this resolution to him.
- Greek Mission. Ffihly.—On the subject of re-commencement of the Greek Mission, it was agreed that the matter be remitted to the Board.

The Board also submitted the following minute of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Scotland, which was ordered to be entered in the minutes.

- Minute of Re. "It was moved, seconded and agreed to that the thanks of Synod be formed Pres-recorded to the brethren of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower bytrn. Synod Provinces for their generous conduct in reference to the portion of the grant made by the B. and F. Bible Society."
- Board re-ap- The Board was re-appointed with the addition of the Rev. Alex. Ross pointed. Pictou, and with Rev. James Waddell, as a corresponding member.

Report on Po. Resumed consideration of the report of the Committee on Popery. pery. The Rev. William Murray moved, and Professor King seconded,

That the Report be received, and the diligence of the Committee approved: that the Synod while expressing their approbation of the grand object of Protestant organizations in general, do not express any opinion, as to the nature or character of any organization in particular; and instruct the Committee to prosecute their efforts for the evangelization of Romanists.

While the discussion was going on the hour of adjournment arrived. Concluded with prayer.
