Harper, of the University of Chicago: Dr. 1. H. Buckley, of New York; and Mr. Leon H. Vincent, of Philadelphia.

An interesting part of the programme for 1896 will be a conference under the charge of Mrs. Emma P. Ewing, the well-known domestic economist. The problem as to how the income of the average American family can be most wisely and economically utilized for shelter, food, dress, decoration, education, etc., will be discussed by such authorities as Mrs Jenness Miller, Miss Anna Barras, Mrs. Emma P. Ewing and others.
