CONSECRATED BISHOP OF LON-DON ON SUNDAY, 6th INST.

Right Rev. Mgr. McEvay arrived in London on Friday evening, August 4, by the 540 G. T. R. train, from Guelph, where he had been in retreat proparatory to his consecration as Bishop of London. He was met and warmly greated by the Administrator of the dlocase, Very Rev. Joseph Bay ard, Dr. Kilroy, of Stratford, and the city clergy, as well as a deputation of laymen.

Sunday, the 6:h inst, the feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ will be a memorable day in the ecciestastical history of this city and diocese of London. It was the day on which the diocese of London received its new chief pastor, by the consecration of the Right Rav. Forgus Patrick McEvay, in St. Peter's cathedral, to be Bishop of the diocese

"In the goodness and readiness of

his soul he appeased God for Israel. Therefore He made to him a covenant of peace, to be the prince of the sanctuary, and of His people, that the dig-nity of priesthood should be to Him and to His seed forever." (Ecclesiasticus, xiv. 29, 30)
