The C.P.R.'s old offices at 67 and 68 King
William St., London, E.C., Eng., are being

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The G.T.R. and the C.P.R. have reduced
the minimum rate on small packages from 15
cents to 12 cents a pound.

The Hamilton, Ont., Street Ry. has been in
the habit of selling workmen's tickets good at
certain hours in the day at eight for 25c., but
finding that they were being used by all
classes of the community issued an order
prohibiting their sale by conductors. The
city council obtained an interim injunction
directing the company to continue to sell
tickets as heretofore pending the trial of the
general action which was set down for hear-
ing Oct. 10. The company has issued direc-
tions to its conductors setting forth what
classes of workers are entitled to the eight for
a quarter tickets and who are not.
