It was my intention to introduce a motion at this meeting to ask your opinion as to the advisability of diverting some more of this money along the lines, if possible, of publishing the reports of our meetings. If we are short of funds I think no better means could be taken than making use of some of this money to properly finance this society. But as it is somewhat late I will leave this matter over until next meeting.

Dr. Murray moved, Dr. Peterson seconded, "That a vote of thanks be paid to the retiring officers."
