Anxious as men may be for work, what can a man do in a worn-out gaping boot? And the children, how many of them cannot get to school because they have no boots or shoes to go in!

On St. Valentine's Day the choir boys had a sleigh drive under the care of Mr. Willoughby Norrie. On their return they were feasted and warmed with cake and coffee under the kind management of Miss Street and Miss Wyatt.
