Whitehall, Dec. 10, 1840. The Queen has been pleased to command that the following directions, given by her late Majesty Queen Adelaide for her funeral, should be made public.

Her Majesty has desired that these directions, which are the result of her own feelings, should be as far as possible carried into effect, and for this purpose has been pleased to sanction a departure from the ceremonial usually observed in the funerals of the Kings and Queens of the realm.
