have been made for 1980 have been made with a view to accommodating the situation for this year within a broader context of ongoing negotiations for a long-term solution to the tuna dispute.

The arrangements for 1980 will give tuna fishermen of each country access to this resource and to the highly favourable market conditions that prevail this year. Although the U.S. embargo will be removed, Canada will pursue its action before the GATT for a ruling against measures of this nature.

U.S. fishing vessels authorized to fish tuna in Canadian waters will operate in keeping with any applicable Canadian laws and regulations while in the Canadian zone.

Within six weeks, negotiations will be initiated on a bilateral treaty to apply in following years which will provide for reciprocal access to both fisheries and designated ports of the other country. Both sides have agreed that such a treaty should be in place by June 1, 1981.
